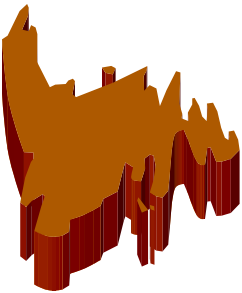

Program – Discovering Newfoundland

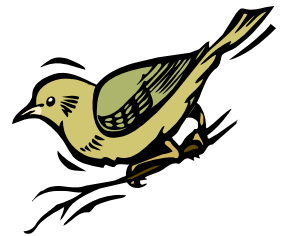


Newfoundland is perhaps the most scenic, unspoiled area of eastern North America. But it also has a good infrastructure, making travel easy. Karl Anderson and Gale Cannon have made nine trips to "The Rock", eight of them in the course of leading natural history tours.

This program will visit some of the sites and sights of the Avalon Peninsula, then follow the track of a wildflower tour through the forests, bogs, and barrens of the Western Peninsula, from Gros Morne north to the Strait of Belle Isle and the Norse settlement site at Anse-aux-Meadows.

Directions to the new meeting location: The Wenonah Community Center (former train station) is located at E. Mantua Avenue and N. East Avenue, Wenonah, NJ. From Woodbury, travel south on Woodbury-Glassboro Rd (Rt 553), and make a left at the light onto Mantua Avenue. The community center is approximately 1/2 of a mile ahead on the right (at the railroad crossing). There are small parking lots near the Community Center along East Ave and West Ave, plus additional parking is available along the surrounding streets.

Field Trip – Birding at Palmyra Cove Nature Park **Saturday September 20th, 9:00 AM to early afternoon** **Trip Leader: Gary Lizzi**



Palmyra Cove is well known as a fall migration hot spot. Join the Gloucester County Nature Club as we hope to identify and sort through the "Confusing Fall Warblers". As many as 18 species of warblers are possible to be seen there. Bay-Breasted, Cape May, Tennessee, Nashville, Chestnut-Sided, and the elusive Orange-Crowned warblers hopefully will be seen. Many of the migrant rarities that are listed regularly on "Rare Bird Alerts" are found at the Cove. We will meet outside the main building at 9:00 AM in the main parking lot.

For those who want to, we will carpool/caravan to the Cove. We will meet at Timberline Shopping Center in Sewell at **8:00 AM**, leaving there promptly at 8:15 AM. Bring a lunch and beverage. Picnic tables are available, as well as restrooms in the main building. If you prefer to drive on your own, directions are below. Travel time to Palmyra Cove is roughly 45 minutes.

Directions:

Take I-295 north to Exit 36B, for Rt 73 North. Travel north on Rt 73 towards the Tacony-Palmyra Bridge; at the last light before the Toll Plaza, make a right at Souder Avenue. At Temple Boulevard, which is the second cross street, make a left; just before the Toll Plaza, make a right into the toll

building parking lot; travel through the parking lot and remain on the Local Access Road; at the end of the road, make a left into the Palmyra Cove Nature Park; the main building is located on the right side.

Trip Report – Members' Garden Tours - Saturday August 16, 2008

The weather was lovely and the flowers were at their best for this tour of GCNC members' gardens. Butterflies had been relatively scarce during July but populations burgeoned in August, so tiger swallowtails, black swallowtails, monarchs, cabbage whites, silver-spotted skippers, and several other species were in good numbers on the day of this tour. Ruby-throated hummingbirds, goldfinches, and other birds added to the display. Attendance was good but not excessive, so that the garden owners and the visitors had the opportunity to chat at length about the gardens, and perhaps to quaff a refreshing lemonade while admiring the floral displays. Natural Events for the month of September

- The last brood of monarch butterflies emerges and flies south to Mexico.
- Black gum foliage turns red - first tree to get its autumn color.
- Wild grapes ripen - not all of them are sour.
- Turtle eggs hatch and hatchlings emerge and head for the nearest water.
- Robins begin to join together in large flocks
- Most hummingbirds depart by the end of the month
- Bats busy feeding – building fat reserves for hibernation and migration.
- Broad-winged hawk migration peaks in mid-month - plan a visit to a hawk lookout.
