Program: Lichen: The Fungus Among Us.

Trees secretly talk to each other underground. They're passing information and resources to and from each other through a network of mycorrhizal fungi—mykós means fungus and riza means root in Greek—a mat of long, thin filaments that connect an estimated 90% of land plants. Scientists call the fungi the Wood Wide Web because 'adult' trees can share sugars to younger trees, sick trees can send their remaining resources back into the network for others, and they can communicate with each other about dangers like insect infestations.



The relationship between these mycorrhizal fungi and the plants they connect is now known to be ancient (around four hundred and fifty million

years old) and largely one of mutualism, in which both organisms benefit from their association. In the case of the mycorrhizae, the fungi siphon off food from the trees, taking some of the carbon-rich sugar that they produce during photosynthesis. The plants, in turn, obtain nutrients such as phosphorus and nitrogen that the fungi have acquired from the soil, by means of enzymes that the trees do not possess.

This presentation is an overview of the important roles that lichens and fungi play in the environment. The three main types of fungi will be explained, with a focus on mycorrhizal associations with plants. Discover the many ways that people and animals use lichens. Join Jennifer to gain a better appreciation for the beneficial and amazing relationships of the fungi kingdom.

Jennifer Bulava is the Lead park Naturalist for the Burlington County Parks System and is responsible for planning and coordinating nature programs and all other aspects of environmental education for the public within the Burlington County Parks System.

- November 17 (Sunday) at 2:00pm Join Freddie Patane and Charles White at Old Pine Farm Natural Lands Trust for our "Walk in the Wild" on Sunday, November 17, at 2pm a fireside chat and workshop on How to Create Cordage and Tie Knots. We will retrace the steps of our ancestors to learn how to create cordage (aka string and rope) out of natural fibers found in wild landscapes. This workshop will include identification methods for cordage plants and trees, harvesting techniques, and the most commonly used twists and splicing methods used to create material suitable for primitive nets, fishing lines, bowstrings and lashing materials. Learn the essential knots that will allow you to make good use of your new cordage. Attendees will have an opportunity to practice these skills "hands-on" with synthetic and natural materials and leave the class with a natural cordage bracelet or bookmark! Meet at the Willoughby House at the end of Pine Avenue, off Good Intent Road in Blackwood Terrace, or you can put "340 Pine Avenue, Deptford" into your favorite mapping service.
