The Gloucester County Nature Club begins its new season of programs with a visit from the Cape May Zoo's ZOO-2-U team. The spacious and beautifully landscaped Cape May Zoo, situated on 80 acres just outside Cape May Courthouse, NJ, is considered one of the best small zoos in the country, attracting over ¾ of a million visitors a year. This evening the Cape May Zoo is coming to us with a program that that will explore the diverse realms of The Animal Kingdom, with live animals from all four classes of land dwelling vertebrates: *Amphibia* (Amphibians), *Reptilia* (Reptiles), *Aves* (Birds) and *Mammalia* (Mammals). We all know that animals exist with an incredible diversity of size, shape and color, but the diversity here is far more t han just skin deep. Learn how these animals are different and how they have evolved unique bodies, abilities and behaviors for survival. Join us for a close encounter with the Animal Kingdom and for a program that will be fascinating and educational for young people and adults alike.

<u>Directions:</u> The Holy Nativity Lutheran Church is located just off Rt 553 (Woodbury-Glassboro Rd.) immediately south of the traffic light at Mantua Ave. The church parking lot can be accessed by entrances on either Woodbury-Glassboro Road or Lenape Trail (first left off of Mantua Ave).

Field Trip - Morning Nature Walk at Wheelabrator Wildlife Refuge

Meet at 8:00 AM at the Wheelabrator parking area. This will be a leisurely walk, about one mile in each direction, on a wide, level trail to a viewpoint on the Delaware River. The focus will be on birds and butterflies, but dragonflies and flowers will not be ignored.



Directions: See your guide to the <u>Natural Places of Gloucester County</u>. Or, from Interstate 295 Exit 23 (Route 130) take Route 130 North for about 0.8 mile. The entrance road for Wheelabrator is on the left. The refuge parking lot is on the right side of the entrance road, just before the main gate. Directions: From Rt 55 Exit 53A (or Exit 53 if coming from the south) take RT 553 (Woodbury-Glassboro Road) south for about 1.5 miles to Holly Avenue. Turn right (west) on Holly Avenue. Continue for 1.2 miles to the park entrance, which is on the left. There is a small sign. Drive past the sports fields; meet at the pavilion.

Kid's Corner - Become a WebRanger for the National Park Service (NPS)* by Deb Maka

The WebRangers is the National Park Service's on-line Junior Ranger program for kids of all ages. You'll be able to learn about our National Parks and play over 50 games.

What you need:

- A computer with access to the internet. If you don't have a computer at home, you can go to a public library and use a computer there. Remember to ask your parents permission before signing onto the internet.

How to become a WebRanger:

- Go to the website: http://www.nps.gov/webrangers
 - o Sign up to be a WebRanger
 - Select a WebRanger name (The NPS tells you not to use your real name.), pick a password, and select your location (the country is required, the state is optional). This is all the personal information that is required to sign up.
 - o Select a secret question which is only needed if you forget your password
 - o Take the WebRangers' Pledge: "As a National Park Service WebRanger, I, (your name), promise to learn about our national parks, to help care for them, and to care for my surroundings."
 - o Print your WebRanger Identification card

Things you can do after becoming a WebRanger:

- o Create your ranger station
- Play activities
- o Send a postcard
- View park webcams

- Turtle eggs hatch and hatchlings emerge and head for the nearest water.
- Robins begin to join together in large flocks
- Most hummingbirds depart by the end of the month
- Bats busy feeding building fat reserves for hibernation and migration.
- Broad-winged hawk migration peaks in mid-month plan a visit to a hawk lookout.
